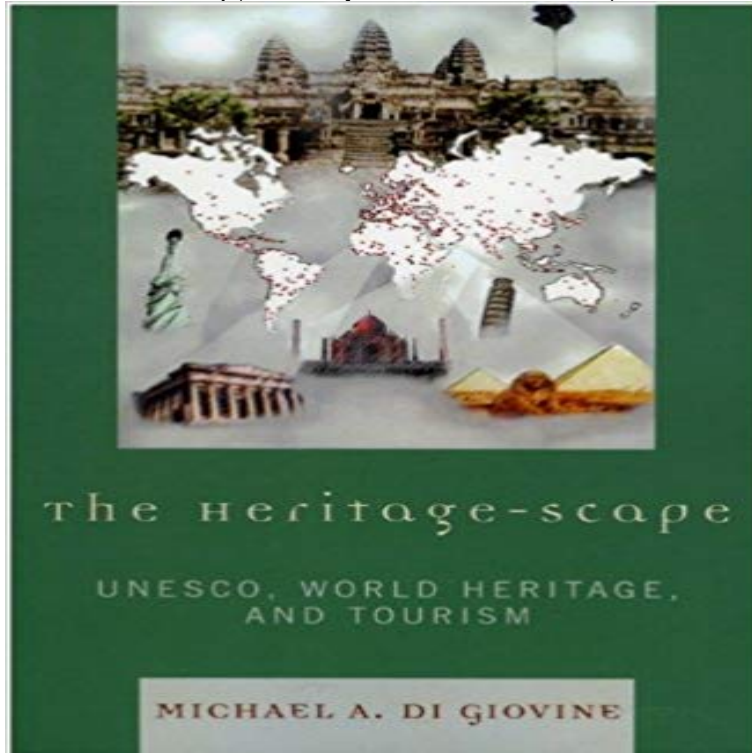


## The Heritage-scape: UNESCO, World Heritage, and Tourism
