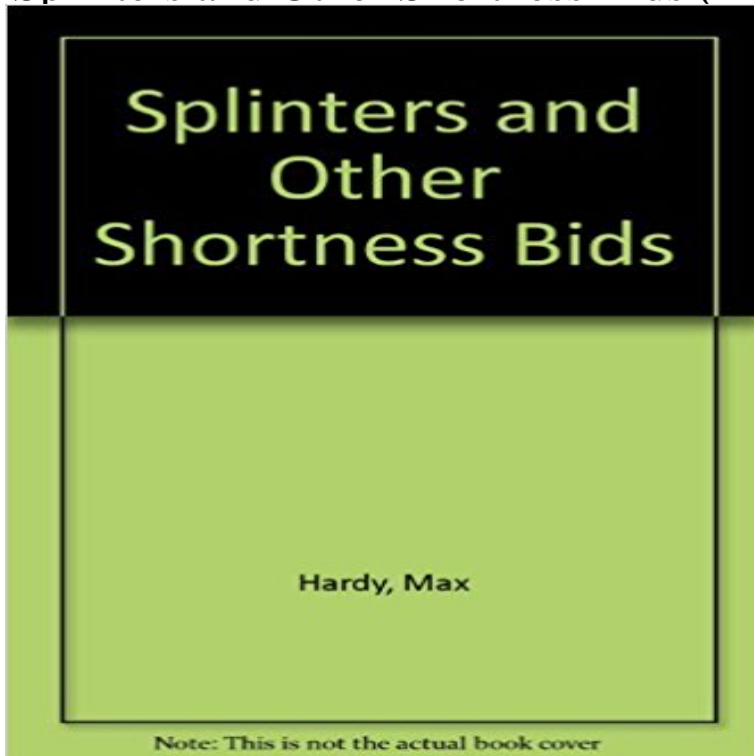


## Splinters and Other Shortness Bids (B-4)
