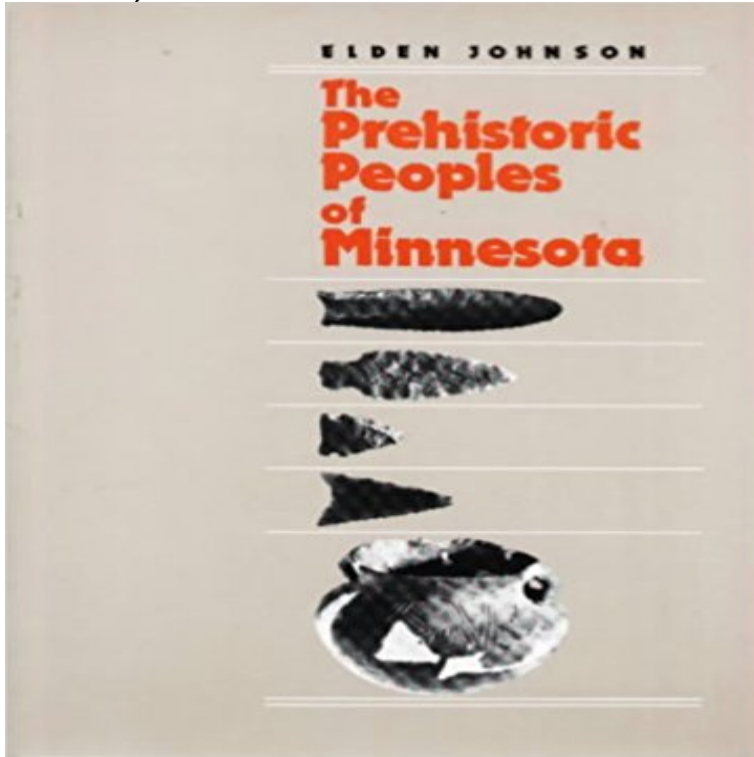


Prehistoric Peoples of Minnesota (Minnesota Prehistoric Archaeology Series)
